Additional Home Education Information

Students are required to school a minimum of 180 days a year for 4 hours a day. Eight hours a day is not considered two (2) days. A day is a minimum of 4 hours. A minimum of 4 high school credits must be earned each year to be considered a student. A minimum of 4 core courses must be taken for non-high school students to be considered a student.

Parents must keep the original records of the student's grade and attendance forms and send a copy twice a year to WOLCA. WOLCA will keep a permanent record of these grades on file at its facility

A high school credit consists of at least 150 classroom hours (50 minute class X 180 days). A student may only earn three (3) total credits in 7th and 8th grade combined. The maximum number of credits a high school student can earn in a year is eight (8). Twenty-two (22) credits must be earned for graduation.

Generally, physical education credits are earned at 1/2 credit per year because students tend to only get 75 hours of physical activity each year.

Economics should include micro and macro economics.

Electives may be chosen based upon the students academic interests. There are numerous possibilities for electives but not all courses chosen will meet requirements.

Dual Enrollment may be used for junior and seniors but does not release the parent/guardian from the responsibility of home education. Parents may use Dual Enrollment (and/or tutoring) as a portion of their home-education program, however, it is not a substitute for home education. With appropriate permission, it may be possible for high-school juniors and seniors to receive HS credit and college credit in certain courses. Student must be approved by WOLCA for dual enrollment prior to the first day of classes. Contact the administrator for approval via wolcademy@gmail.com. Usually, a college will request a transcript from WOLCA prior to dual enrollment.

Seniors must be registered with WOLCA by August 1 of the year they plan to graduate in order to be considered for graduation in May of that school year. A minimum of six months of academic classroom instruction is required before graduation will be approved.

Graduating students may participate in the WOLCA graduation to be located at the WOLCA or Word of Life Assembly of God facility. Fees may apply (cap and gowns, etc.). Graduation will be conducted for Kindergarten, 8th grade, and senior students at the completion of all work and submission of grades for that year. Please submit your final grades at least two weeks prior to graduation day.
