

High School Information

<u>Registration</u>-Student must be registered as an on campus student or home educated student for a minimum of 6 months to qualify for graduation.

<u>Testing</u>-Student must score at least a 19 on the ACT (or SAT equivalent) or pass an assessment test given at WOLCA to qualify for graduation. Acceptance by a college may qualify student for graduation, as well.
